A Message From Principal Dave McCall:

Chatfield Friends and Families,

Parents Right to Know

As a parent of a student at Chatfield Elementary School, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teacher who instructs your child. This is a requirement for all districts that receive Title1 funds. Federal law allows you to request certain information about your student's classroom teacher. The law also requires the district to give you this information in a timely manner upon request. Listed below is the information about which you have the right to ask for regarding your student's classroom teachers

- Whether the Colorado Department of education has licensed or endorsed your student's teacher for the grades and subjects taught.
 - Whether CDE has decided that your student's teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
 - The teacher's college major: weather the teacher has any advanced degrees, and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
 - Whether any teachers 'aides or similar Para-educators provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.
